

Dear Applicant,

If you have completed the **BAS degree at the University of Cape Town**, you may qualify for Automatic Entry (Auto Entry) into the BAS (Honours) programme.

According to the UCT Handbook (FHA1.3):

Automatic Entry – Honours Degrees

In recognising the BAS Programme presented at UCT as the main feeder degree for the Bachelor of Architectural Studies Honours Programme, all students who obtain a credit-weighted average of **70% or higher**, calculated across the following subjects **combined**, will be afforded automatic entry into the BAS (Honours) programme:

- **APG3023W – Technology III**
- **APG3037W – Design and Theory Studio III**
- **APG3000F – History and Theory of Architecture V**
- **APG3001S – History and Theory of Architecture VI**

Important Note

Even if you qualify for Automatic Entry, you are still required to submit an official UCT application for the BAS (Honours) programme. Automatic Entry does not replace the online application process.

Please note that Automatic Entry only exempts you from submitting Sections 1 and 2 of the Honours portfolios. You are still required to submit **Sections 3 and 4** as outlined below.

Submission deadlines:

- International Applicants: 31 August 2026
- South African Citizens: 15 November 2026

Section 3: Practical Work

Your practical work portfolio must include:

- A detailed report covering at least six months of architectural work experience, describing your tasks and learnings month by month, with supporting photographs and drawings.
- At least one 2D and one 3D CAD drawing that you have produced.
- Written confirmation from the architect/employer verifying the duration and nature of your work experience.

Section 4: Independent Work

Your independent work submission must include:

- An illustrated essay of up to 3,000 words on your chosen architectural study-travel topic.
